

How digital illustrator Destiny Darcel gift made room for her with with no drawing experience.

Interview day. And of course I'm tested to see if I bend or break. First impressions are everything and already things aren't going my way. The kids activities were canceled during my scheduled interview time which means there's background noise. And lots of it. There's banging and screaming and fussing over toys. A house of three toddlers running around looking for mommy to tell who isn't sharing. Who needs a snack and who needs me. As I hide in the closet trying to navigate everything before my interview with Destiny Darcel; the super talented and beautiful digital illustrator who's work I've admired from a far for some time now. I realize I'm in the closet. On the floor, terrible lighting and to add the cherry on top, zoom isn't allowing me to record our interview! How am I suppose to remember all this. The interview starts in 3,2,1....

Scrambling, turning my camera off and asking Destiny to hold before I even introduce myself instantly breaks me out into a hot flash! I dash out the closet into the madness of toys, crying and noise galore! All while trying to dodge each kid so they won't see me. I take my sons phone to record at least the auto. As I run out his room back to my hiding spot, his face is priceless. Wondering if he should run too or is there a reason why I took it. My hands are trembling and palms are sweating as I swipe back and forth, searching for the voice memo app. What took about one minute maybe even two seems like five each second I can't locate the app. Finally! I press the red button. It starts to record. I look over at zoom take and deep breath and jump right into it.

**HSJ:** Hey, ok I'm back. Sorry about that. I'm having some problems with my zoom so I won't be able to record the live interview with video only the audio.

**Destiny:** Hi, it's ok. You're fine, no worries at all

HSJ: Thank you so much for making time for this interview. So I'm Rae, editor-in-chief of Henry Society Journal. Which is a modern monthly newspaper for women in business who look like us. And I really want to talk about you and your success. Your journey to entrepreneurship and how you evolved up to this point. Let's jump right into it! How did you get started?

**Destiny:** It began during COVID. I was working at Apple and in grad school for user experience design. When COVID hit I lost all motivation for school and completely stopped doing classes. Online school wasn't working for me. I was still employed with Apple although COVID took a toll on business. They had us doing little odd jobs like features of the phone and little diagrams and what not. I've always been good in photoshop but it's not the same as drawing. I began making collages of myself on my Finsta, posting things that were aesthetically cute to me. But I wasn't drawing vet. And one day I was scrolling and saw an illustration and thought how cute. I wanted to edit the photo to make it look more like me. I screenshot it and uploaded it onto photoshop. Made a few edits, I posted it and tagged the original artist. At the time I wasn't thinking anything of it. People are inspired by others work all the time. I gave her, her credit. Everything was off to a good start. But I was wrong. She reported the photo as copyright infringement! I was so shocked! And upset because it wasn't that deep. So out of spite and revenge, I asked my dad to buy me an iPad. The goal at first was just to level up on her. I got the iPad pencil and started my journey. I started drawing and figured out my style.

**HSJ:** Have you always considered yourself an artist?

**Destiny:** No not at all. I didn't know I knew how to draw. I felt challenged and I don't back down from a challenge. Fueled by something else originally, birthed my passion. In hindsight,



I understand why she reacted the way she did. As an artist I completely get it now. But at the time that's not how I felt and she was the villain in my story. But I'm thankful for that moment. It was a vulnerable time because I thought about what people would say about my art. But that incident gave me the fuel to post my work. Also, it was perfect timing because it was around BLM and a lot of my drawings were surrounded by the BLM movement and that really built up my following. My community was formed and started booming!

*HSJ:* What's your profession technically? **Destiny:** Digital illustrator.

**HSJ:** How do you explain what you do to

**Destiny:** It's still difficult to explain. People ask what I do and I just say I'm an artist. We're such a small community but I'm an digital artist. And if you know about this community you know about all of us. However, landing brand partnerships like with Old Navy and BET that solidified things and made it a lot easier to explain that yes I get paid to make this black art!

**HSJ:** Speaking of brand partnerships, how did you land Old Navy and BET?

**Destiny:** For BET, I thought it was originally a scam. They messaged me on Etsy. It was not BET directly because they outsource with a third party. But reluctantly I followed up and I asked them what they needed? That was my first and I learned a lot such as my worth, what I should or could charge.


And Old navy fell into my lap. They emailed straight up like how much would you charge for black History month shirts. We had a zoom, they told us their vibes but loosely to give us creative space. It was three artist total and we all created 3 very different art. It was a quick process. I made two variations and they picked one. I flew to San Francisco, for the photoshoot. I thought I was That So Raven!

HSJ: Who inspires you?

**Destiny:** It's gotta be myself! Because it changes overtime. In college it was this person or that person but now that I have built a business from the ground up it really is me. It's me! It's something so difficult. I never pictured this for myself. It's so hard to be consistent and build a community. To quit your job, start a business and take that leap of faith.

HSJ: What did your leap of faith look like?

Destiny: It was excellent! I moved to ATL after college. I transferred from the Apple store in Kentucky to ATL Apple. It was a drastic difference. It was very black and very supportive. My manager Kyle pushed me. Not to quit but to go for it and if it doesn't work out don't worry about it. He left the door open for me to come back. Next I talked to my mom. She said to save 6 months rent and do it. My mom offered help me mail out my orders and whatever



**HSJ:** How do you face adversity?

Destiny: I cry first! Then I call my mother. There's been a lot expensive mistakes. That's what gets you. But you have to make them. You have to loose money to learn. It's not an option! Those expensive mistakes are lessons. I'm from Kentucky and Kentucky is Kentucky. In the beginning I had companies who would refuse to print my art because my prints didn't align with them. Real crazy obstacles. But you fine tune them. You can't be scared to make them but they are scary but I still make them even till this day. Consistency and disciple is extremely hard but that's what separates us from the rest. The drawing isn't hard. The consistency is what's hard.

**HSJ:** What can you tell individuals that are afraid to start because the market is "overstatured"?

**Destiny:** People buy from people. There's only one of you. The market can never be overstated. You're one of one.

**HSJ:** Define success.

Destiny: Success means freedom of movement. Period. Before I started anything, grad school was depressing. I use to tell my mom I want freedom to do and be. Go where I want, buy what I want. I want to look how I want to look. I want to do what I want to do.

**HSJ:** Do you remember you first sell?

Destiny: I don't remember the first sell because I am digital but I remember my first time mailing off prints. My first five prints I had to mail off. It was awful. I put them in the mailer, in wrapping paper but I hadn't put the names on them. I was headed to the post office and almost hit a car. The orders went flying and got all mixed up because I didn't write the information on the package. Everyone got the wrong order! They all contacted me about receiving the wrong order, I couldn't believe it!

**HSJ:** What's your favorite quote? **Destiny:** It's on one of my illustrations: "Your gift will make room for you."

HSJ: Do you have a favorite podcast?

Destiny: No, I don't care too much for podcasts.

But if so it has to be about true crime. I want to solve the case! Who did it?! Who is the suspect?!

HSJ: No to podcast, But what about books? Recommendations? We have a new love for reading. Destiny: I love to read! I love reading fictional stories. I want you to take me there and paint the picture. I love the fantasy especially a series. One of my favorites is, Game of Thrones the book because I can't watch people in pain. ### Give Me a C-O-L-O-N-I-C

Cheer for poop with hydrotherapist Candice Williams of A Cleanse Within Hydrotherapy Clinic

I could remember it like it was yesterday. Our assignment was to create an elevator pitch for our entrepreneur class and recite it to our classmates for feedback. I was lucky enough to be in the class with Candice Williams, owner of Cleanse within Hydrotherapy Clinic in Marin, California. Her elector pitch was quick, straight forward, informative, had personality, made me want to learn more and book a colonic all within 2 minutes. But the part that stood out the most was when she self proclaimed herself as the poop cheerleader! I thought it was genius and catchy. And if you couldn't remember any of the information provided or her background one thing you would remember is that she's the poop cheerleader. Being a fan of shark tank there's always something clever you remember about a pitch or there's something you hear in a pitch that makes you want to dig deeper into a business. And in that moment I knew she was going to go far and be remembered! But what exactly was a colonic and was I ready for a little back door healing? It was only one way to find out. The first step would be getting an interview with Candice, the second would be in her words, "buttering up the bullseve," and actually getting a colonic. First let's dive into the interview:

HSJ: Hey, Candice. How are you? I'm so excited for this interview because I've been itching for more information about this topic and you're the perfect person for this field. So open and thorough.

**Candice:** Absolutely. I love my job and I want to educate as many people as I can. Especially our people.

**HSJ:** Right. There's so much information surrounding colonics but first let's rewind a bit. What is a colonic?

Candice: Colon Hydrotherapy aka colonics is the method of removing waste from the large intestine gently using water. That's the simple answer but there's more to it.

HSJ: So how did you get into this field? Did you always want to do this? What's the back story?

Candice: I started going myself for hydrotherapy sessions because I had digestive issues. I started asking a lot of questions during my session and learned that a lot of our health issue start in our gut. And our culture not all of us but most of us eat really unhealthy and rich foods. In additional to all the preservatives that is in our foods. We don't know what all that is so we must cleanse our bodies. Disease starts from what we eat. When I first started getting colonics I lost like 20 pounds. I couldn't believe it. Long story short one thing lead to another, I got certified and began my journey.

HSJ: Wow. Ok, not to make this a racial topic, but what made you want to open your own clinic being a black woman knowing how uneducated our community pertaining to this topic?

Candice: Well, for one I want our people to know this isn't a vulgar, painful process. Two, I feel it's my mission to educate as many people as I can. There's a misconception about the procedure but that's why I take pride in informing everyone where I go. It's more than just promoting  $\,$  my business. I really hope to make a difference. I want all of us to feel better. I want all of us to live longer and healthier lives. We have so much stored waste in our colons that needs to be out of our bodies. From undigested medicine we've taken to food that's clogged.

HSJ: Wait! Medicine can be undigested? I have so many questions but explain the process. Because the vision I have in my head I'm sure is exaggerated.

Candice: The process is simple. There's a big misconception of colonics. But it takes about an hour and 4 sessions are recommended because we do have five distinct parts of the colon: it is composed of the cecum, ascending colon, transverse colon, descending colon and sigmoid colon. The process begins with the machine filling our stomachs up with water. Once our stomachs are full we begin the release process. We'll do that for about an hour. Fill and release. After your done you'll sit in the infrared sauna for 30 minutes. This step is amazing. You're detoxing from the inside out. That's the difference between infrared sauna and a regular sauna.

**HSJ:** Does it hurt? I think that's what people

think about. Candice: No, it's not painful. Now don't get me wrong it can be uncomfortable. We're use



to things going out not coming in. Plus our stomachs are being filled with water so it can cause light cramping. The process is like a fill and release. Fill our stomach with water, give our bellies a little push then release. And as the water is being released it's also cleaning and hydrating all of our other organs in addition to releasing the waste out. I know this topic isn't something people want to hear or even something people want to do but it's necessary. I promise you you'll feel so much better after.

**HSJ:** What are the size of the tubes that we have to insert?

**Candice:** The enema nozzle is about the width of my pinky and you only need to insert about 2" The poop that we release on a regular basis is bigger than that. And just a side note, if you poop and it look like balls that's a tell tell sign to get a colonic. Why? Because it has taken on the shape of your colon. Meaning it's been in there for some time.

**HSJ:** What does a colonic feel like?

Candice: You will feel movement through your abdomen during the procedure but no different than if you were at home. The main difference is you're on a hydrotherapy bed with 102 degree water being filled in your belly. Which can be quite relaxing for most people.

**HSJ:** What's one reason you always tell potential clients to receive a colonic?

Candice: You instantly shed pounds! Listen, bite the bullet and butter up the bullseye. It won't hurt and it's healthy. 13-30 pounds of poop can be stored in our colons. And after one sessions you can lose at least 3-5 pounds.

**HSJ:** I love it! Butter up the bullseye! Now that we have a better understanding of colonics, can you tell us more about your entrepreneurial journey thus far? Starting with what is it like being the first black woman-owned hydrotherapy clinic in Mill Valley? Mill Valley is one of the most affluent and best places to live in California.

**Candice:** Absolutely. Well I definitely owe God all the glory. I'm also thankful for Renaissance women's business entrepreneurship program. They helped a lot. San Francisco has a lot of programs for small business owners right now and I'm taking advantage of everything! I actually missed out on additional assistance from San Francisco by opening up in Mill Valley. I was actually working for a lady at a hydrotherapy spa in Mill Valley prior and many of my clients followed me to MY new home. I love Mill Valley. It's a great fit for my market.

**HSJ:** Great! So you didn't launch to an empty room. That's exciting to have dedicated clients follow you. Did that create friction with the woman you worked for? Especially with her knowing you were leaving and she could be losing clients aka revenue?

Candice: Did it! That's a whole story within itself. But it was all a learning experience. It taught me grit, dedication and believing in myself. When you grow and make clients they become like family. So I informed many of them I was leaving and they decided to follow. So as much as it may appear I took clients I didn't. They left when I left.

**HSJ:** That shows a lot about you and the bonds you built with your clients. You mentioned that you were certified, will you or do you plan on teaching courses/trainings?

Candice: I can see myself in the long term doing that. But right now I'm still building myself and my business to where I want it to be. It's a lot and sometimes I get overwhelmed.

**HSJ:** That's completely understandable. And the journey is always better than the destination. You still have time to pass the baton. Before I let you go, can you define success from your point of view?

Candice: Success to me is actually starting and not giving up. I've been through so many things in my life that I could have given up years ago. I could have accepted what life tried to say was all I was worth but here I am. A business woman. I would have never imagined I would own my own business. No matter how many obstacles I'm faced with in this process I just keep going. Slow process is better than no process.
